Achleck - Estate Withdraws

It is with great regret that USCA has to report that, despite being informed at the beginning of November that an outline agreement had been reached (see minutes at end of this newsletter) we have now been notified that the "Estate has to withdraw from the proposal ...due to cash flow difficulties...". This means that the huge amount of time and effort invested in the Achleck project has come to nothing so far.

The Estate has offered to discuss the refurbishment of the two existing cottages, which USCA is willing to explore further **but** this would not provide accommodation of a sufficient size to meet the requirements of the Scottish Government grant and so cannot be a 'replacement' for the plans for Achleck. USCA will need to establish as quickly as we can if the offer of grant monies can be moved to another location within the area.

In view of the above, certain decisions have become much more urgent and so it will be a priority that USCA becomes a legal entity in its own right and also becomes a charity to mitigate the tax implications for any donors of land.

USCA - Caolas Ulbha Project



We are very pleased to report that USCA has obtained funding under the All Our Stories stream of the Heritage Lottery Fund. The Caolas Ulbha project will receive £9,000 to research, record and celebrate the heritage of the area.

The project will be run in partnership with the school and the aim is to involve the children and as many local people as possible. One of the main aims of the All Our Stories stream is

to provide an **opportunity for everyone** to get involved in their heritage. The project itself will involve: investigating paper records, recording individuals' own stories, recording family stories and welcoming contributions from people with family links to the area but who no longer live here. It is a requirement of the funding stream that all the results of the project should be held in a digital archive and be available to as many people as possible. The plan is to have as much of the project results as possible in both Gaelic and English.

As part of the project we will be subscribing to the genealogy website Ancestory.co.uk. This membership will allow access not just to census and church records but also the manifests of emigrant ships. We plan to hold some drop-in sessions when people can come and use this resource to explore their own family stories, wherever they originate from. It is important to stress that whilst USCA has obtained the funding, the Caolas Ulbha project is open to everyone in the area, whether they are USCA members or not.

- 2. Minutes of previous meeting: Proposed SM & Seconded EM.
