We realise that speaking out with ideas can be a difficult thing to do in public, so we have a variety of ways to allow you to make suggestions, anonymously, in person, or on-line. We are also having a second drop in session on the evening of Monday 18th if you can't make Saturday 16th.

There will be food at the evening meeting, and if you've got an instrument and fancy a tune bring it along and we'll have a ceilidh.
